- The structured program includes 1½ hours of homework or tutoring support and ½ hour of game and activity time
- Mentors are supported by trained school personnel as well as a supporting volunteer manager from HandsOn Suburban Chicago
- Specific mentor/tutor training will be provided to all mentors at the start
