Bob Lyons Reports



By now you will have no doubt seen the Civic Federation's latest ideas to save the state money at the cost of Illinois teachers and other public employees. They have first proposed consolidating the Illinois Teachers' Retirement System with the Chicago Teachers' Pension Fund. Their argument will be that it will save some amount of money, but there are better and more compelling realities that both are better off apart. Less than twenty years ago CTP was 100 percent funded, but the city then asked and received the state's permission to declare a pension holiday. There was the obvious result and, while their funded status is still ahead of ours, they are not only not well funded, but their fund is also much smaller than ours. Each board has their own investment policy and both would be opposed to consolidation just in terms of control of the fund. The Civic Federation's concept is just that, an

idea, and is far from being a bill. Given the obvious rivalry between the city and the rest of the state, this proposal is not happening.

Their second idea is one we have been expecting: "a constitutional amendment limiting pension protection." Since any attempt to limit benefits that have already been earned would be thrown out as unconstitutional, the Civic Federation proposes to limit protection only on those benefits teachers and public employees would earn in the future. That of course means it would not apply to anyone who has already retired, but it would imperil the amount of revenue that comes from active employees that the states uses to pay benefits to those of us retired. Since cutting benefits and what workers pay for them does not take away from what they already owe to current retirees, this idea actually offers little benefit to the state. Where the state gets their revenue in no way changes what they owe. It is difficult to see how this proposal will ever reach the stage where it would be a proposed constitutional amendment.

Keeping your membership up-to-date with both our local as well as the state IRTA is still an important thing to do, but do not lose any sleep out of concern for what the Civic Federation has proposed so far. Remember that our organization and its 36,000 members is the only group whose sole goal is to protect you and your pension and health insurance. The IRTA exists for that reason.

Did You Know...

.....

....that due to the budget crisis in Illinois, the Secretary of State's Office is no longer reminding you to:

1.) purchase a new car license plate sticker (check your license plate for the expiration month),

2.) take your car in for required emissions testing?

To electronically renew your car license sticker and receive car license reminders in the future, register at the Secretary of State website at : <u>www.cyberdriveillinois.com</u> and click on "email My Renewal Notice". Motorists are also notified whether a vehicle emissions test is required before the registration is renewed."

According to the EPA website, normally, "Vehicles must pass an emissions test or otherwise comply with the Illinois Vehicle Emissions Law of 2005...before the vehicle's registration (license plates) can be renewed." But the Secretary of State is temporarily allowing license plate renewals for vehicle owners who have not yet passed the EPA emissions test.
