IRTA led the fight when the Illinois State Supreme Court ruled unconstitutional last year, the legislation that

would have drastically reduced our pension benefits. It was not the unions which is what you would believe if all you know about it is what you were told by the media.

Rest assured this will continue to be our number one goal. The state of Illinois is in worse shape financially now than last year. The legislature will continue to look for ways to reduce the amount of money it has to provide to Illinois public pension programs. We have to remain vigilant to head off any steps the legislature may try to take, that could jeopardize that benefit payment we receive each month. The same applies to the state subsidized health insurance that is so crucial to the financial well-being of many of us.



Bob Lyons Reports



By the time you are reading this the state of Illinois will have gone a full ten months without the required state budget. At the same time, Illinois continues to spend money made possible by a combination of continuing resolutions, state and federal judicial edicts and several legislative acts that have been agreed to by the governor. The Illinois House and Senate on April 22 passed a \$600 million emergency funding bill that will prevent some Illinois public colleges and universities from closing. Gov. Bruce Rauner lauded this as an example of bipartisan cooperation, so I assume he will have signed it into law. As things stand now, the state could end the current fiscal year with a \$10 billion deficit.

Someone said, "OK, that's the problem, what's the solution?" As far as Springfield is concerned, I am afraid you know the answer. There is none. There has been talk in the legislature of a progressive income tax to replace the 3.75% flat tax that we now have, but that would require an amendment to the constitution. With the vote of the legislature (if 3/5 of each house of the General Assembly approve the amendment) the change is then submitted to the voters at the next general election, which would be this November. All legislative Republicans, representatives and senators, are opposed to any change in taxes that would increase revenue. While there are more than enough Democratic senators that will vote for a progressive income tax, Speaker of the House Mike Madigan will need all 71house Democrats to pass the tax. Representative Jack Frank of McHenry has pledged to go against his party and vote no. Without at least one Republican to break ranks and join theDemocrats, an amendment for a progressive tax does not appear possible this year. There was nothing in the possible legislation that I saw that would have taxed retiree income, social security or annuities. Including us and other senior citizens in the bill would doom the amendment to failure. Even if you would want to help, they are not going to ask us. The problem remains that if you ask the governor and the legislators, "What is the plan?" Their only answer is, "The other side needs to compromise!" Sadly that is where we were ten months ago. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: Clearbrook needs volunteers for JellyBelly Days on May 20 and 21. Volunteers collect donations and distribute Jelly Belly packets at storefronts and intersections throughout the Northwest suburbs. Volunteers are scheduled for two-hour shifts between 6:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Fri. and 6:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Sat. There is a need for drivers to provide transportation for seniors who can no longer drive and need to be taken to appointments, shopping and other errands. Volunteers provide a

coordinator with their available hours and then are given an assignment. Drivers are needed in Maine, Wheeling, Schaumburg and Elk Grove Townships and must have a valid driver's license and insurance.

Drivers are also needed for Elk Grove, Wheeling, Palatine, Evanston and Hanover Township Meals-on-Wheels programs. Drivers pick up the meals and then deliver them to individuals who would not eat properly without this service. It generally takes about two hours to complete the route and there are various scheduling options - once a week, once a month or other choices.

If you live near Euclid School in Mt. Prospect you might be interested in going to the school once a week between June 11 and Aug. 18 to maintain the bird feeders in their courtyard. You can set your schedule with the building custodian. 


Did You Know...
